

Our ash trees are dying from the die back disease, again this comes from across the Channel. Global warming is blamed for it all. What can be done about it? What else is to come?


# **ROB THE RAINMAN**

#### **RAINFALL REPORT**



June's total was 15.5mm this being only 30% of the average so at last a break from rain, rain, rain. So it was a lovely, sunny June month then. Er nope far from it. It did start warm over the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 3<sup>rd</sup> but then, whilst dry, it was a very dull and cloudy period with just a few sunny spells. It was also chilly by day and quite cold be night. There was a bit of rain mid month before the dull, dry and chilly weather continued until we had a 4 day period of real warmth from the 23<sup>rd</sup> to the 26<sup>th</sup>. Even then the first two days were very cloudy and had a mostly dismal

feel. This didn't last as the month went out on a repeat of the dull and chilly theme. It was a very disappointing June when we needed it to step up. July's total was 62.3mm this being about 30% more than the average. So it was back to the wet stuff. And it was wet with a ten day period to start the month with 13.5mm on the 5th and 18.2mm on the 8th. Then there was a brief respite before 16.3mm on the 15th. Finally it did turn dryer and like June we had a very warm "spike" around the 18th to the 20th before the month went quietly out in a very mediocre manner. Two thirds of the summer gone and it has been very poor indeed except for the two warmth spikes each month.

# RECTOR'S LETTER

The UK needs a "moral vision" to move past the rioting that has erupted in towns and cities across the country this week the Archbishop Canterbury has said. One problem is that some people today think that Jesus was a fictional character and not areal person.

Gandalf the Wizard, Elizabeth Bennet and Inspector Morse are all fictional characters who have been brought to life by actors on the stage, in films or television and radio productions. When we're reading we often build up mental pictures of the characters in the story. When we watch the dramatisation of a book we know, we may be surprised, disappointed or pleased by the way characters are depicted. It might open up new ways of thinking about the whole story for us.

Of course one person's interpretation of a fictional character is as valid as another's and it can be exciting to see or hear different productions of books such as The Lord of the Rings, Pride and Prejudice and Inspector Morse.

The representation of a real person may not be quite so straightforward, however. If that person is, for example, Mozart or Oliver Cromwell, we have to rely on contemporary descriptions, letters and other documents that build up a picture of their life and personality. And we usually have no way of knowing how close the portrayal is to the real person.

The people of Israel have built up in their collective minds a picture of the one they call God's anointed one, Messiah, who will come to set them free from tyranny and establish God's kingdom of justice and peace, and they look out for signs that he may be coming soon.

Both the crowds following Jesus and those who are hostile towards him have mind pictures of God's anointed one, which are getting in the way of the truth. They cannot see the reality of a God who comes alongside us as a human being and feeds our spiritual hunger with the revelation of his grace and truth, his mercy and compassion and his all-embracing love

We probably all have our own mind pictures of what Jesus was like. If we are looking for a portrayal in art or drama that resonates with our mental image, there are thousands upon thousands of representations of Jesus and the events of his life to choose from – from his birth to his crucifixion.

The message is that, in spite of the staggering cost God had to pay, God came to live among us and to walk alongside us, so that we can know that God understands our experiences, our thoughts and our emotions and so we can learn from God whatever is necessary for our spiritual and eternal lives. Jesus is the living bread that came down from heaven to find us and to bring us to and keep us in eternal life – we can only accept that gift with wonder and thanksgiving.



#### THE LEA PARISH COUNCIL

Up to date information is normally available at www.theleaparishcouncil.gov. uk but, until a new Clerk is brought onboard and settled into the task, the information will not be all that it should be unfortunately. You can continue to make contact via clerk@theleaparishcouncil.gov.uk

**ELECTION:** in order to fill a vacancy for a Parish Councillor, Lea Parish Council intended to co-opt a new member at a routine council meeting scheduled to take place on Wednesday 4th September. This being the usual procedure and incurring no cost to the parish. However, as permitted, a notice in writing was made by an elector to Herefordshire Council calling for an election and this has now been scheduled to take place on Thursday 12th September 2024. As a result, co-option is not possible and the quite significant election costs will all be charged to Lea Parish Council to be settled out of precept funds provided by Lea parishioners.

Applications for inclusion as an election candidate or register to vote must have been made prior to publication of the September edition of *The Chimes*.

By the time of publication, a speed indicator device provided by Lea Parish Council should be in operation next to the A40 in the vicinity of The Oaks. This is intended to be rotated to other sites periodically.

A significant sum has been earmarked by Herefordshire Council to use S106 funds to undertake a soft traffic calming scheme within the village. It is hoped to start work before Christmas, however Lea Parish Council has questioned why parts of the village have been left out of the scheme and it would be sensible not to elaborate further until final go ahead is confirmed.

The other important matter to note is that Lea Parish Council does not have a Parish Clerk currently and the search for an appropriate person to fill the vacancy is ongoing as a matter of urgency.

A lot has been said regarding the Covid epidemic which began in December 2019, the majority of it negative. There have, however, been a few positive outcomes, one of which was a renewed interest in walking, since this was one of the few ways to exercise during the pandemic.

The following example takes a purely local look at what has happened in the last few years.

Andy Parr came to live in Upton Bishop in 2014 and as he and his wife were already keen walkers, they walked many of the local footpaths in the first years of their new residency. Because of this, in 2019 Andy decided to become the Parish Footpath Officer for Upton Bishop.

Before Covid struck most of the paths were in need of some care and during the time he was clearing and repairing them (after taking a special scything course!) he remembers that there were not many walkers around. As the epidemic took hold, Andy found that many more local people were starting to use the paths.

In October 2022 Ross Walkers are Welcome were invited to work with the Wye Valley National Landscapes (WVNL - previously the Wye Valley AONB) team to increase access to the countryside/ Protected Landscapes, with funding from DEFRA. This project started by removing stiles from the major long-distance trails through the area and, as Upton Bishop was on the

Herefordshire Trail, it benefited from new gates on that route as well as some of the linkages to it. Later phases of the project concentrated on creating more stile-free walking circuits in and out of the WVNL area and links to local bus routes. By March 2024 Andy, plus contractors and other local volunteers had replaced 14 footpath gates in the Upton Bishop area, one of which is on the front cover. These gates have been really appreciated by landowners and walkers — and their doos!

This is only one small example of great work being done by PFO's and volunteers throughout the parishes served by The Chimes.



The walk you see opposite is called Hartleton Water and it is there to give you a taste of what we hope will develop into a database of walks with photos and info.

# **LINTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

(Covering Bromsash, Gorsley and Linton)

The Parish Council has obtained Herefordshire Council (HCC) approval to place a Speed Indication Device (SID) on the B4221 at the east end of Gorsley to monitor and record, and hopefully decrease, the speed of vehicles passing through the village. This is one component of a concerted Parish Council and Geardown for Gorsley community effort to address the danger posed to residents by speeding vehicles. A SID on the B4221 in Bromsash continues to have a worthwhile impact curbing the speed of traffic there. The Parish Council continues to press HCC for greater engagement on Gorsley and the B4221 with a view to reducing the speed through the village to 30mph and 20mph near the school.

The Parish Council has commissioned tree surgery on a group of ash trees suffering from die-back on the Quarry perimeter, which represent a danger to residents and footpath walkers. An application for funds to replace the four existing stiles along the footpath from the road just west of Burton Court towards Bromsash near Eccleswall with gates, awaits HCC approval. HCC have agreed the installation or replacement of "Unsuitable for HGV vehicles" signs on parish roads at the corner of the B4221 and Quarry Lane, Manse Lane, Pound Farm Lane and Burrups Lane (West).

A plot on the Gorsley Allotments has become available. If you are interested in taking this up, please contact the Parish Council Clerk, Rich Hunt, via e-mail: pcclerk@lintonpc-herefordshire.gov.uk or telephone: 07763793695.

There have been two Parish Council meetings since the last Chimes update. The meeting on **25th June** was attended by five councillors and by members of the public.

The council considered two planning applications (240124 and 241275 Upton Court Stables) and supported the applications.

The council received an update on Parish finances and agreed to pay the salary for the clerk and payments to the Lengthsman. The council agreed to grant a donation to the parish Lego Club for £100. The clerk briefed the council on the Annual Accountability Return (AGAR), including approving the Publication of Rights for the period 1 July – 9 August.

The council was briefed on the Lengthsman work plan for July and August and received a Highways update and update from the Footpath officer on Public Rights of Way funding along with planned work around the parish (including replacement of stiles, finger posts, gates, and maintenance work).

On **6th August** the Parish Council held an Extraordinary Meeting. This was attended by all 8 councillors along with members of the public.

The council considered two planning applications (240124 and 241275 Upton Court Stables). These were amended applications published by Herefordshire Council for re-consultation. The council supported the applications.

The council then went into a closed session, without the public present, to consider a legal matter.
